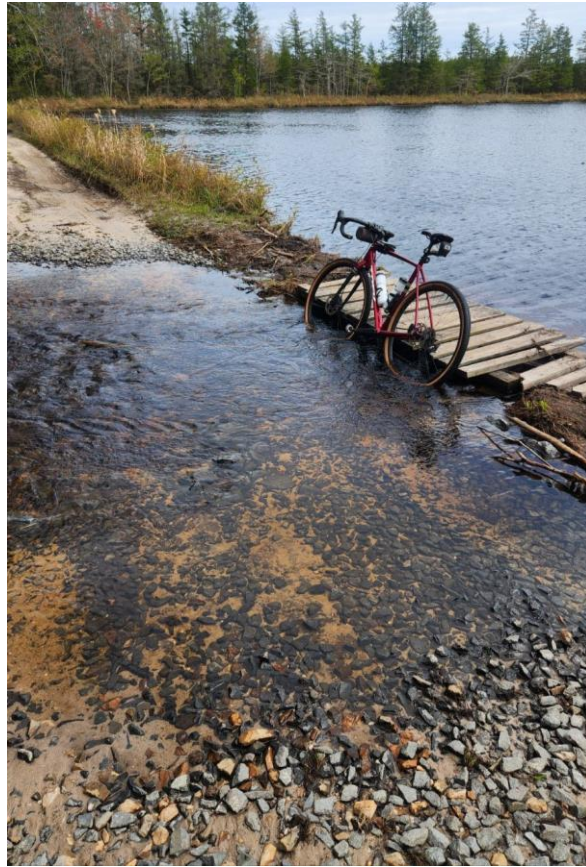


STREAM CROSSINGS!



We're using the Mt. Misery (white blaze) Trail, and it is spectacular! It takes you through the Atlantic White Cedar Preserve and passes the abandoned Reeves Cranberry Bogs.

However, this stretch has 2 stream crossings; both have rocks, gravel, and sediment on the bottom

The 1st is typically very shallow, like riding through a moving puddle. The 2nd is deeper and wider. Last weekend, it was ca 4" in the middle and 8" by the crude walkway, but the water level can vary day-to-day and hour-by-hour.

Whether you choose to ride through it or walk over it, exercise caution, be aware of your fellow riders, and prepare for wet feet. It's all part of an authentic Pine Barrens adventure! The stream crossings are located at approximately these Mile Markers:
